Director IET, Dr. Sanjay Goel presented the Programme Structure for various branches of B.Tech and M.Tech. programmes. He also tabled the MoM of the Board of Studies meeting, held on May 04, 2019 (*Annexure-2*).

Suggestions:

- University should think big and think differently.
- IET should organize hackathons regularly; JKO can also collaborate in this
 effort.
- IEEE student chapter should be started as soon as possible to avail of the various facilities and grants offered by IEEE through its chapter.
- · Faculty should publish their papers in high impact journals.
- In order to nurture self-learning, it should be made compulsory for every student to complete at least one course through MOOCs.
- Co-teaching is welcome and must be encouraged.

Dr. Sheetal Mundra made a presentation on the curriculum structure of Pinnacle MBA, BBA and the new programs with UMass, Amherst, USA, duly illustrating the highlights as under 7.1A. She also tabled the MoM of the Board of Studies meeting, held on April 19, 2019 (*Annexure-3*).

The Council, after deliberations, approved the same.

Suggestions:

- Introduce an elective or two in Pinnacle MBA on 'social issues' and 'history of business houses' under liberal studies courses.
- 2. There must be inputs on 'analytics' in all functional areas.
- 3. Visibility about new programs has to be increased.

10. Tabling of the Curriculum for B.Des. with tabling of the minutes of the Board of Studies Meeting held on May 18, 2019.

ADean-IoD, Prof. A Balasubramaniam presented the curriculum structure of the four-year B.Des. programme in (i) *Product Design*; (ii) *Interaction Design*; and (iii) *Interdisciplinary Design*. He also tabled the MoM of the Board of Studies meeting held on May 18, 2019 (Annexure-4).

The Council, after deliberations, approved the same.

Suggestions:

- Industry involvement, without compromising on quality, will indeed enrich the programmes.
- Members cautioned against filling up the curriculum with one credit courses and suggested clubbing similar courses into large credit ones.
- Societal aspects of 'Design' should be taken into consideration and 'Design' should invest itself in Public Policy program, as well.
- The positioning of the university must be publicized through a media blitzkrieg.

11. Centre for Communication & Critical Thinking

Dr. Richa Mishra, Assistant Director, CCCT briefed about the courses being delivered by the Centre for Communication and Critical Thinking (CCCT). She briefly explained all the six courses offered by the CCCT across all the programs of the University.

Council was happy to know about the courses and some of the other key activities of CCCT like *Reading Circles, Focused Groups (Writing), Public Speaking and Open Office Hours,* offered by the CCCT.
