

The initiative is supported by Samarth Community, India's leading eldercare organisation. The noble initiative was launched by Dr. Joga Ram, District Collector of Jaipur.

The helpline is being run entirely by a team of JKLU faculty, staff, students and alumni led by Prof. Umesh Gupta and a committed core team of some senior faculty and staff members of the university.

"Older people, especially those with pre-existing medical conditions like heart disease, lung disease, diabetes or cancer, are more prone to getting affected by coronavirus than other age groups. In Rajasthan, we have seen a good number of senior citizens affected by it and many of them are lonely and secluded, without any support. The toll-free number has been launched keeping in view the distressed life of senior citizens, as there is no dedicated wing that works towards their needs. They can call us anytime between 9 AM and 7 PM for assistance,"said Dr R L Raina, Vice Chancellor, JK Lakshmipat University.
